DOCKLANDS

London's Docklands, an important inner city development to the east of London, stretches from Tower Bridge to the Thames Barrier at Woolwich. It is a fascinating combination of high-tech architecture and industrial history. To find out more about the area visit the London Docklands Visitor Centre. Other attractions in the area include Canary Wharf, Europe's tallest building, the Design Museum and the Thames Barrier Visitor Centre. For the best view of Docklands, take a cruise on the River Thames.

The river can be crossed underneath at the Greenwich Foot Tunnel, which takes you

right to the historic village of Greenwich. There is much to see here, including the National Maritime Museum, Royal Naval College and Old Royal Observatory.

Getting around Docklands is easy. The Docklands Light Railway (DLR) serves most of the north bank, and is a good way to see the area as it runs above ground. Buses and Underground trains serve both the north and south banks and the rail network provides services on the south bank.
