COURSE MARK:

How it is Calculated / Clarifications

The mark presented on the list with the exam results is actually the <u>Course Mark</u> (Semester) which represents the total of the <u>Exam Mark</u> and any <u>Extra Credits</u> to which a student may be entitled.

[i.e.: <u>Course</u> Mark = Exam Mark + Extra Credits]

These **Extra Credits** are the ones given from:

- regular attendance participation
- writings
- oral presentations
- debates
- achievement quizzes (if any given)
- other tasks

If, however, the total of the exam mark and the extra credits still does not come up to a 'pass' mark (i.e. 5\10), then only the exam mark is presented!! In this case, students who are unsure as to what extra credits they have taken during the semester can contact the instructor. Moreover, any extra credits a student is entitled to are also added to the student's September exam mark, but are not valid for any following semester.
