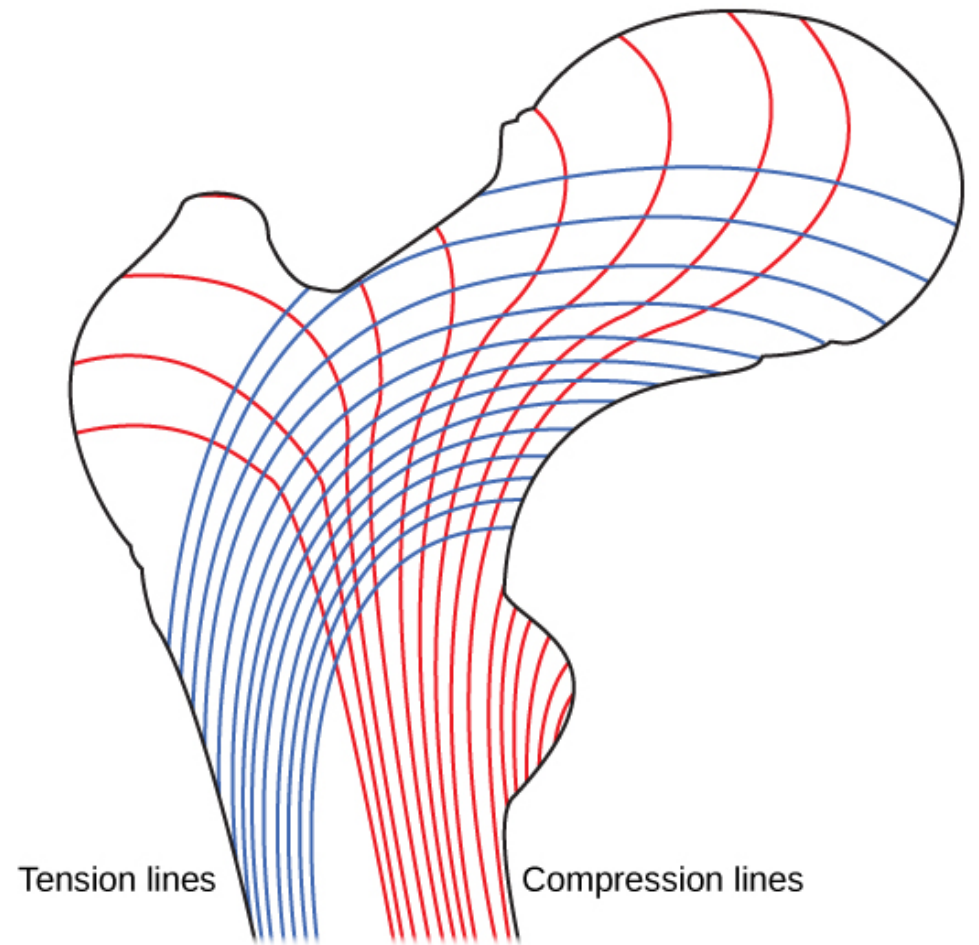
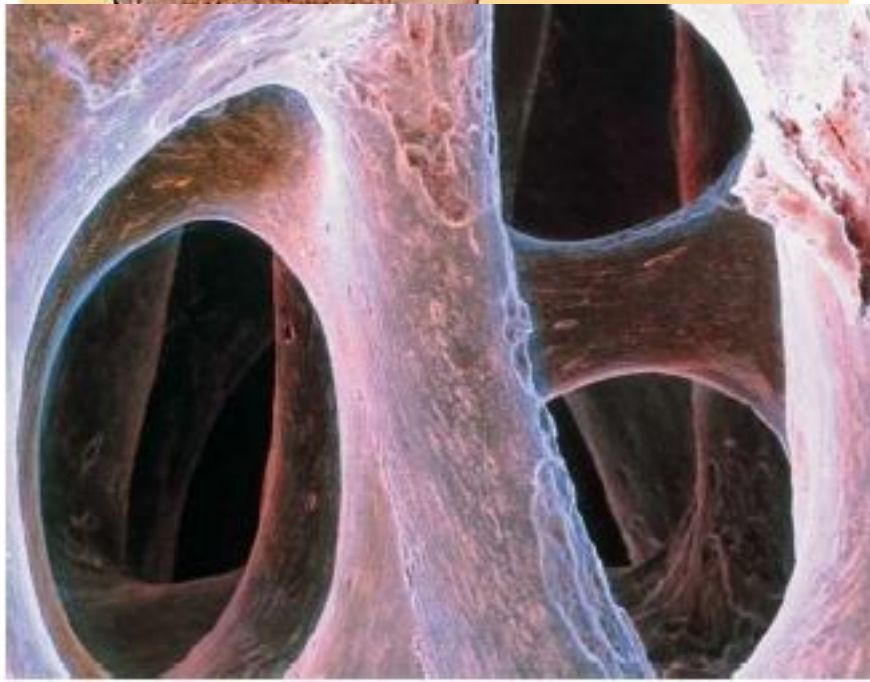
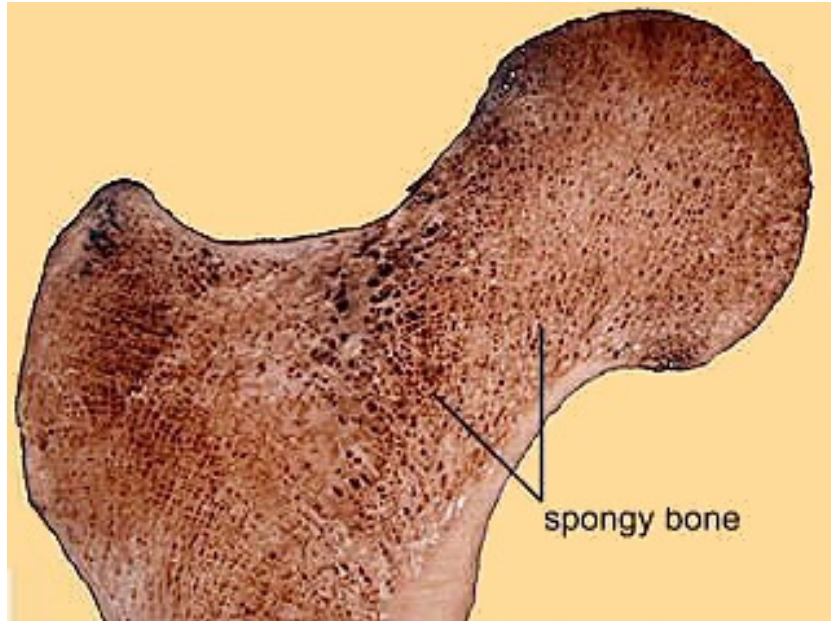
If surface tension determines growth :

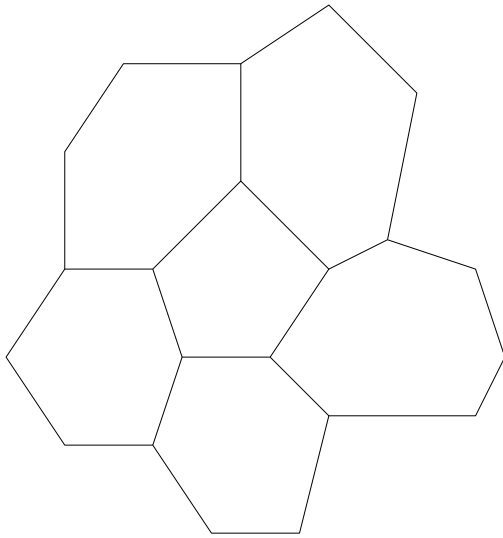
$$\frac{dS}{dt} = C_1(n - 6) \quad \text{Neumann - Mullins (2d)}$$
